Meeting Intro

OA's Unity with Diversity Policy

As we extend the heart and hand of the OA Fellowship to those who still suffer, let us be mindful of OA's Unity with Diversity Policy, which respects our differences, yet unites us in the solution to our common problem. Whatever problem you may have with food, you are welcome at this meeting, regardless of race, creed, nationality, religion, gender identity, sexual orientation, or any other trait.

On Health Problems

The following passage is from the Big Book of Alcoholics Anonymous. This sage advice can also be applied to the disease of compulsive eating:

"We, who have recovered from serious drinking, are miracles of mental health. But this does not mean that we disregard human health measures. God has abundantly supplied this world with fine doctors, psychologists, and practitioners of various kinds. Do not hesitate to take your health problems to such persons. Most of them give freely of themselves, that their fellows may enjoy sound minds and bodies. Try to remember that though God has wrought miracles among us, we should never belittle a good doctor or psychiatrist. Their services are often indispensable in treating a newcomer and in following his case afterward." - AA 4th Edition, Chapter 9, pg. 133

Welcomes & Introductions

Welcome Home! If you are new to this meeting, we welcome you especially! We would invite you, and all members present here today, to write a brief introduction in the chat. Please share your name, whereabouts you are located. If you would like to be contacted, please also leave your contact details if you wish. Please indicate if you are available as a sponsor. You may also wish to share a little about how your recovery program is going today, or maybe something you might wish to leave at the virtual door.

OA Preamble

Overeaters Anonymous is a Fellowship of individuals who, through shared experience, strength, and hope, are recovering from compulsive overeating. We welcome everyone who wants to stop eating compulsively. There are no dues or fees for members; we are self-supporting through our own contributions, neither soliciting nor accepting outside donations. OA is not affiliated with any public or private organization, political movement, ideology, or religious doctrine; we take no position on outside issues. Our primary purpose is to abstain from compulsive eating and compulsive food behaviors and to carry the message of recovery through the Twelve Steps of OA to those who still suffer.

The Twelve Steps

- 1. We admitted we were powerless over food—that our lives had become unmanageable.
- 2. Came to believe that a power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity.
- 3. Made a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood Him.
- 4. Made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves.
- 5. Admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.
- 6. Were entirely ready to have God remove all these defects of character.
- 7. Humbly asked Him to remove our shortcomings.
- 8. Made a list of all persons we had harmed, and became willing to make amends to them all.
- 9. Made direct amends to such people wherever possible, except when to do so would injure them or others.
- 10. Continued to take personal inventory and when we were wrong, promptly admitted it.

- 11. Sought through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God as we understood Him, praying only for knowledge of His will for us and the power to carry that out.
- 12. Having had a spiritual awakening as the result of these Steps, we tried to carry this message to compulsive overeaters and to practice these principles in all our affairs.

The Twelve Traditions

- 1. Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends upon OA unity.
- 2. For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority—a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern.
- 3. The only requirement for OA membership is a desire to stop eating compulsively.
- 4. Each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups or OA as a whole.
- 5. Each group has but one primary purpose—to carry its message to the compulsive overeater who still suffers.
- 6. An OA group ought never endorse, finance, or lend the OA name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property, and prestige divert us from our primary purpose.
- 7. Every OA group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions.
- 8. Overeaters Anonymous should remain forever nonprofessional, but our service centers may employ special workers.
- 9. OA, as such, ought never be organized; but we may create service boards or committees directly responsible to those they serve.
- 10. Overeaters Anonymous has no opinion on outside issues; hence the OA name ought never be drawn into public controversy.
- 11. Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, films, television, and other public media of communication.
- 12. Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all these Traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.

Meeting Content

{Ask for Time Keeper} Timekeeper please set your timer for minutes. When time is up, unmute yourself and say time. Then whoever is sharing, please then round off your sentence to finish up your share.
TOPIC MEETING: This is a Topic meeting! Today's topic is I will post the topic in the chat, and you are free to share on this, or any other topic that is relevant to your recovery at this time.
SPEAKER MEETING: This is a Speaker Meeting! The speaker[s] describes his/her story for about twenty minutes and shares their experience, strength, and hope. Members are invited to share for three to five minutes.
LITERATURE MEETING: This is a Literature Meeting! Today we are reading from" Members may take turns to read the text through and share at the end. When you have finished reading, please say pass to allow someone else to take over where you left off.
Only <u>OA-approved literature</u> is shared at this meeting. We do not screen-share OA copyright literature, according to <u>OA's Copyright Procedures and Guidelines.</u> Many OA members find that reading our literature on a daily basis further reinforces how to live the Twelve Steps. More information about how to obtain <u>OA literature</u> will be provided in our announcements later in the meeting.
Please remember that when we read ANY Alcoholics Anonymous literature aloud in a group, we are asked to read it exactly as written. When reading it silently, many of us find that we can identify more easily by substituting words such as 'compulsive eating' for 'alcoholism,' and 'food' or 'binge food' for 'alcohol.'
DAILY READER MEETING: This is a Daily Reader Meeting! Today we are reading today's entry in the following daily readers: FOR TODAY & VOICES OF RECOVERY. Please open your {Daily Reader} to page {page number} on{date}. May I have a volunteer to read this passage? Following the reading, we will open the room to shares.

REPORTS:

This is a suggested opportunity for the meeting secretary to share any OA announcements, and to celebrate birthdays & milestones. Ideally, Intergroup

Representative's report and Treasurer's report are to be given once a month.

7th TRADITION:

According to our Seventh Tradition, we are self-supporting through our own contributions. Your contributions go towards this group's expenses: Zoom account access, web-hosting, chips, pamphlets and postage. We send regular contributions to the Virtual Region, and the World Service Office (WSO) to help carry the message to other compulsive overeaters.

Give as if your life depends on it! We encourage OA members to give as much as they are able, to help our group be self-supporting.
